



Code of Conduct

Membership of Skerries Sailing Club (SSC) is a privilege and carries with it a responsibility to uphold our reputation at every opportunity and not to engage in conduct that brings the Club and its members into disrepute or is contrary the Constitution of SSC.

There are many members in Skerries Sailing Club and members & visitors of SSC have a duty to ensure that they cause no adverse impact on any of these members as a result of their actions at SSC, during activities hosted by SSC members, while visiting other clubs, or in the wider environment.

Members & Visitors must behave in a manner that facilitates, enhances and ensures the:

1. Reputation and standing of SSC
2. Amenity of other members of SSC
3. Health, safety and comfort of staff employed at SSC
4. Enjoyment of visitors to SSC
5. Physical property and facilities provided by SSC

Members & Visitors shall not engage in conduct that:

1. Breaches accepted standards of public behaviour
2. Jeopardises the health and safety of members, staff, and visitors (on and off the water)
3. Causes offence to members, staff and visitors
4. Lessens the amenity and enjoyment of members, staff and visitors
5. Damages, destroys, or lessens the value of SSC assets
6. Damages, destroys, or lessens the value of property owned by other Club members

Any member bringing the Club into disrepute may be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the SSC Constitution.

Any visitor breaching this code may be asked to leave the premises.

Any visitor who does not recognize or demonstrate an ongoing understanding of this code of conduct will be asked to stay away indefinitely.
